As befitted by its sporting nature, the **Derby Bentley** was almost always fitted with an owner-driver saloon or drophead coupé coachwork, the « standard » designs being the work of Park Ward.

Chassis number « **B178CR** » however, was bodied by **Vanden Plas**, which had forged its considerable reputation by a most fortuitous alliance with Bentley, for whom it bodied some 700-or-so chassis during the 1920s, including the **LE MANS team cars**.

Another notable feature of this car is its original sports exhaust, one can drive silently or change the valve and have a sports-car sound.





This car's first owner, founder of the **EKCO Electronics** company, chose a body which was one of the most advanced of its day. Designed by motor dealers **Oxborrow & Fuller**, and produced exclusively for them by **Vanden Plas**, it was known as the « **Continental Open Tourer** » and combined the all-weather comfort of a drophead coupé with the low weight of a sports tourer.

With its concealed window glass and fold-flat convertible hood, it was certainly **one of the most elegant open designs** available.

One can quite understand why it appealed to a man whose business was at the cutting edge of technology, though only 17 were made!

There were some subsequent owners, the last of whom **Peter A. Rockliff** of Grassendale, Liverpool, whom acquired the Bentley in July 1958. When sold at a UK auction in 2005, « **B178CR** » had already benefitted from **rebuilds of the engine and chassis**, and had undergone a **sympathetic restauration**.

Its purchaser in 2005 was the well-known Dutch collector **Franz Van Haren**, who sold the car to another Dutch collector in 2009. In 2018 the current owner bought from this Dutch collector. Since the Bentley came to Holland, it has been **repainted in black** (from magnolia) and the **interior re-trimmed** in brown-cognac (from black) leather. The car was regularly serviced, in **pristine condition** and **maintained over the last 14 years**.
